## PROP A

### \$23,900,000



### Infrastructure Projects - \$5,497,000

- Repair cracked sidewalks at Burnet HS and Burnet MS
- Improve drainage at RJ Richey ES
- Replace HVAC at Quest HS and Burnet MS not addressed in previous bond
- Cover exposed wall insulation at Quest HS and Burnet MS
- Repave existing lots and drives throughout the District
- Add wainscoting in Burnet MS hallways
- Repair/replace roofing not addressed in previous bond
- Add bird control at Quest HS pavilion



### Student Growth - \$10,277,000

- Renovate and expand Bertram ES to accommodate 700 students
- Retain Classic Building aesthetics as part of the Bertram ES project
- Replace 6 yellow route buses
- Purchase 1 special education bus
- Purchase 2 14-passenger buses



### Safety and Security - \$2,390,000

- Secure classroom doors District-wide with card access readers
- Widen and repave "S" curve bridge area
- Add security fencing around elementary school playgrounds
- Add safety windows to 2 exterior doors at Shady Grove ES
- Replace Burnet MS room signage with standardized numbering system
- Add lightning detection system to practice and competition fields
- Install student canopy at RJ Richey ES bus lane

### Learning Environment - \$5,736,000

- Renovate Burnet HS Auditorium
- Improve classroom acoustics at Burnet MS
- Add walking tracks to RJ Richey ES and Shady Grove ES
- Replace flooring at Burnet MS and RJ Richey ES
- Improve ADA access at Burnet MS and Shady Grove ES
- Expand high-impact, flexible furniture to approximately 150 classrooms

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## PROP B

### \$5,760,000

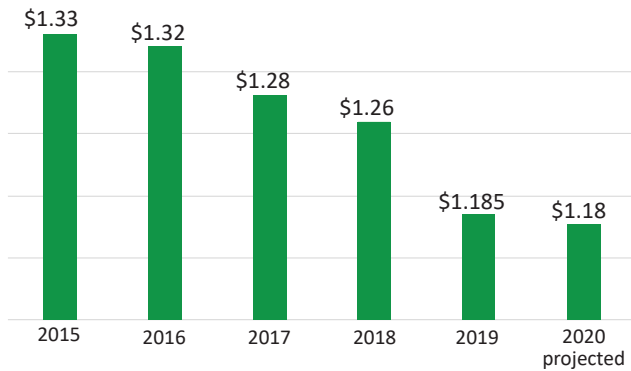
**Athletics**

- Add track and field event space for discus, shotput, long-jump and triple-jump
- Add weight room, baseball, and girls soccer locker rooms
- Install artificial turf, 6-lane track surface, bleachers, and fencing at the BMS athletic field
- Improve drainage at BMS athletic field

### Financial Facts

- Prop A and Prop B will not increase BCISD’s total tax rate.
- Over the past 4 years, the Board of Trustees has voted to lower the tax rate each school year.
- Based on conservative assumptions, the District expects that it can lower the current tax rate to \$1.18 and fund Prop A and Prop B.
- Even with the passage of Prop A, Prop B, or both, BCISD will have the 2nd lowest tax rate in the area based on projections.

### Student Growth Facts

- Bertram ES capacity is 450 students.
- Bertram ES has grown by 33 students since school began in August.
- Bertram ES currently has 404 students enrolled.
- The July 2019 demographic report indicated that Bertram ES wouldn’t reach 401 students until 2022.
- Growth is happening more quickly than projected in Bertram.
- There are no extra classrooms available at Bertram ES.
